## **2SCALE Project Begins**

Our project launch in western Kenya is off to a great start! Benefitting 50 women entrepreneurs and 3,000 Base-of-Pyramid consumers with SoyaKits, our partnerships with IFDC, 2SCALE, and FASUD will reduce the incidence of malnutrition in low-income communities of western Kenya by improving access to affordable and nutritious soy-based food products and economically empowering women and youth. #### VitaGoat Rehabilitations

We are undergoing two VitaGoat rehabilitation projects in Bungoma and Butere, Kenya with partner and trainer Tom Agwa Agalo. These VitaGoat projects are designed to be self-sustaining after a modest initial investment from MM (some to be repaid by the ventures). Agalo will train one operator and 10 individual entrepreneurs to restart the VitaGoat at each site, as a sustainable micro-enterprise to provide income for about 10 women entrepreneurs in each location. Training will include best practices for reduction of transmission of COVID-19 according to the Small-scale Soy Dairy COVID-19 Hygiene Practice Guide issued previously by MM. ## **Food Systems Game Changers Lab**
